WALK ALONG WITH ARNOLD



CARLO MANNOCCI: OUR MAN IN TUSCANY

The last weekend of May (but in reality it looked more like March) I attended, together with other representatives from all continents, the first meeting of the Presidential Office of the Tuscans Around the World. The meeting was in Florence.

It was a good trip even if the weather was really more late winter than late spring. The atmosphere was gloomy, with emphasis on the economic crisis and its ramifications. The sum of money allocated to the Tuscans abroad for 2013 is close to the amount received for 2012. (Our club expects





to get about \$1000.)

Emphasis was placed on the type of functions which will be sustained financially, with a preference for cultural events rather than strictly social gatherings.

I believe that we will survive the crisis by relying more on what we can do to sustain our associations rather than depending mostly on handouts. This is the line of the Tuscan Association of Oregon and we are proud to be able to continue our programs with the contribution of each and every member.

TUSCAN FILMMAKER WINS DAVINCI DAYS PRIZE IN CORVALLIS

How's this for a "small world?" A filmmaker from Tuscany, who directed a documentary about a German orchestra conductor in Florence, will receive a top prize next month for her film at the daVinci Days celebration in Corvallis.

Silvia Lelli, a professor at the University of Florence, has been making documentaries since the mid-1980s. An anthropologist by training, she strives to



get to know her subject as completely as possible.

For her recent project, *Johanna Knauf, Conductor: Music for the People!*, that meant becoming a member of the choir for a series of concerts around Florence. Knauf, a German who moved to Florence to start her own orchestra, is a relative rarity in classical music: a woman conductor. Lelli's film shows how Knauf takes both professional musicians and amateurs – some with no musical training at all – and molds them into a cohesive performing group.



Along the way, the film demonstrates Knauf's ability to go beyond the music of Beethoven and Verdi to reach the music which she believes resides in everyone's soul. The movie's final scene, shot in Florence's Piazza del Signoria (left) illustrates the maestro's consummate ability to merge music, culture, and

human aspiration into a transcendent experience for both the performers and the audience.

Lelli's film will be shown three times in Corvallis during the annual da Vinci Days festival, which this year marks a quarter-century of celebrating innovation and creativity:

Tues., July 16, 7:15pm, at the Darkside Cinemas Sat., July 20, 3:30pm, at the Darkside Cinemas Sun., July 21, 2:30pm, at the Majestic Theater

Lelli will receive the "Spirit of daVinci Award" for her film immediately after the Saturday screening.
